#### **Breathing Spaces**

Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit." ~John 20:21-22

In our already overcrowded lives, another space is being taken away.

When I was learning to write, I was taught that you should have two spaces after a period before starting a new sentence. Now we are told, by no less an arbiter than *The Chicago Manual of Style*, that one space is the norm.

The primary reason the *Chicago* authors cite for preferring a single space is efficiency. Of course, it all comes down to efficiency, as so much seems to these days. They conclude that typing two

spaces "is inefficient, requiring an extra keystroke for every sentence." An extra keystroke? Well, that is simply too much to ask, don't you think?

But I think we need to be fighting for more space, not less. Space gives us breathing room, which is another way of saying that space allows for the inspiration of the Holy Spirit.


J.R.R. Tolkien told the story of correcting student essays, when he came upon a blank page among the papers. He stared at it for a moment and then wrote upon in it, "In a hole in the ground there lived a hobbit." It just came to him like a revelation. And that's how he started his book *The Hobbit*, the novel that leads into *The Lord of the Rings* trilogy. But for that inspiration, he needed that blank page, just a little space between all those words.

Just a little space. The Holy Spirit can work with that.

Becky called the meeting to order at 10:25. Rose led devotions. Pastor Dwight volunteered to lead devotions in May.

Craig, Kathy and Becky shared stories about God's love in their lives.

Because of Lent and Holy Week, Pastor Dwight officiated many services this month. He also visited parishioners at home. In addition Pastor Dwight helped pack meals for Feed my Starving Children.

Craig presented the treasurer's report. We are 75% through our fiscal year. Our income is 76.61% of our budget. Our expenses are at 76% of the budget.

The Lenten offering was split between Feed My Starving Children and the Backpack food program for Taylors Falls elementary school. FMSC received \$614 and the backpack food program will receive \$613.85.

Kathy made the motion and Rose seconded it to use money from line item 3035 (maple syrup fund) to pay \$4450 for tree removal by Wild River Tree Service, LLC. The Motion passed.

Miriam made motion and Becky seconded it to accept the treasurer's report. The motion passed.

The property committee is still planning to remodel the mens' room downstairs and the rest room on main floor. Regrading the south side of the church will be done this spring. Pastor Dwight will look into new chairs for the fellowship hall. We will consider a change to the constitution to raise the amount the council can approve without a special congregational meeting to \$5000. We will take advantage of the Taylors Falls clean up day to dispose of an air conditioner and dehumidifier.

The Season of Renewal task force met on Friday, April 12. The group set goals and generated a document of expectations for an accountability statement. The congregation will be informed of the groups' progress in an announcement during the service. May 4 is the first meeting with other congregations in our cohort at Como Park Lutheran Church.

Bill Davids has agreed to present the next Mission Moments on April 21 or 28.

Sunday School for young children has met twice. There have been 7 students both times. The sessions have focused on a Bible story: Jesus riding into Jerusalem and David and Goliath. The lessons consist of the reading and discussing the story, movement activities and often a craft. Parents and grandparents have been very willing to help make the lessons successful. The plan is to continue the lessons on the second Sunday through the summer.

The council reviewed the events during Lent. People liked the simple meal preceding the Wednesday service at 5:00. It was suggested that the supper could be a few minutes longer. Using the Hidden with Christ service was good.

Everyone really enjoyed the breakfast following Palm Sunday service.

People appreciated the music and the style of service at the Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services.

Easter service was good. The trumpet music helped set the tone.

Craig motioned and Rose seconded to adjourn at 11:30.
